"Betwixt and Between":

Boundaries, negotiations and transitions in SE Europe

The title is quite indicative of the main theoretical concerns of the 9th Student Conference which will be hosted by Democritus University of Thrace in Greece. According to Victor Turner, a well known anthropologist who dealt with the analysis of symbolism and rituals some decades ago, the phrase "betwixt and between" refers to the liminal period in which the individual is found in a marginal state. Individuals found in this marginal state are not yet classified and thus they experience a condition of ambiguity, paradox and confusion.

Turner's notion might prove thought provoking if applied to the modern political, economic and social reality in South Eastern Europe: changing borders, migration and mobility, economic and political instability, social upheavals. In the last couple of years we are witnessing a constant effort on behalf of the Balkan countries to gain trust and economic support from the European Union. Yet it seems as if most countries are caught up in a vicious circle of political, economic and social dependency. In the context described above the conference is intended to be the forum for as much as different "voices" as possible along with different ethnographic examples accounting for the "liminal" and "marginal" situations which inevitably bring up issues of boundaries, negotiations and transitions in SE Europe.

3. Eligibility:

The conference is open to all undergraduate and M.A. and PhD. students from the universities which are members of the Border Crossings Network, as well as to other students from the area and beyond who might find the network interesting. There are capacities for approximately one hundred and twenty (120) participants. Students are expected to present their papers in any way related to the main topic of the conference. The presentation should not exceed ten (10) minutes (plus 5 minutes for discussion). Power-point and multimedia presentations are welcome.

4. Application procedure:

Applicants should send their personal data, including university affiliation, and paper abstracts (around 15 lines) to the responsible coordinator at the home university.

Deadline for submissions is March 21st. Successful applicants will be notified by April 10th, 2011.

5. <u>Cost:</u>

There is no conference fee. However, the organisers are not in position to cover travel costs and the cost of accommodation for participants. Participants will be accommodated in triple and double hotel rooms at the Orpheus and Democritus hotels. The cost for accommodation, including one meal is about 30 EUROS per night and per person.

6. Transportation:

Participants should make their own travelling arrangements. The most convenient way to travel to Komotini is: by plane (or train) to Thessaloniki and from there by bus (or train) to Komotini or by plane to Alexandroupoli and from there by bus to Komotini.

In addition, a bus for the conference participants will run from Thessaloniki to Komotini on the 12th and from Komotini to Thessaloniki on the 15th (this might be free of charge for the participants coming from Balkan countries).
